## Guadalupe Lady Mary

The polychromed cedar sculpture is just over two feet in height. It is a black madonna, in the style known as "Sedes Sapientiae" or "Throne of Wisdom", with the Christ Child seated on MARY's lap. This genre spread from Northern Europe between the eleventh and thirteenth centuries. The underlying sculpture is rarely seen.

The Shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe was the most important Marian Shrine in the medieval Kingdom of Castile. It's revered in the monastery of Santa Maria de Guadalupe, in today's Cáceres province of the Extremadura autonomous community of Spain. Our Lady of Guadalupe is one of three Black Madonnas in Spain. The statue was canonically crowned on 12 October 1928 by Pope Pius XI with a crown designed and crafted by Father Felix Gronda.

According to an ancient legend, the image was made in a sculpture workshop founded in Palestine in the 1st century by St. Luke the Evangelist. Centuries later, she was venerated in temples of *Acaya* and *Byzantium*. 12 Later, Pope Gregory the great gave this sculpture to San Leandro, Archbishop of Seville Visigoth. 13 The Archbishop placed the image in a hermitage on the outskirts of the town. 13 During the Muslim invasion of 711, the Christians of that city deposited it in a box and hid it by the river Guadalupe. In the area of the *Serranía de las Villuercas*, at the foot of the *Sierra de Altamira*. 17

In the 13th century, the Virgin appeared to a cowboy in the province of Cáceres called Gil Cordero next to the castle of allies and told him that there was a sculpture of it along the river Guadalupe. When Gil Cordero was near that river he lost a cow. Later, she found her dead. He went to lay it to take advantage of his skin and before, as usual, he made cross-shaped sign on his belly. Then the cow rose and flew. The Cordero wondered if that would be the place indicated by the Virgin who appeared to him next to the castle of allies. He dug and, within a metre of depth, found the box with the virgin inside. 15 rushed stones and made a hut, where he deposited the virgin. Later, he went to the Church of Cáceres, where he informed the cleric of greater responsibility for his finding and the desire of the Virgin to receive worship in that place. No Obstacle, the clergyman did not believe him. Later, he came home and found his son dead and prayed that the Virgin would return him to life and, in this way, all believe in his miraculous history. When the clerics were set to officiate the burial the son came back to life, he got up and said that a woman had helped him to get up. 15 then the clerics believed and went together, with people of the city, on pilgrimage to that place. When they discovered the hut, they agreed to build a hermitage. 16

According to legend, Alfonso XI met for the first time with this hermitage in 1330, when he was hunting. 16 Alfonso XI was entrusted to the Virgin of Guadalupe in the Battle of the salty of 1340.<sup>14</sup> Being victorious. By this fact, he decided to reform the church, add adjacent buildings and make a shelter for the pilgrims.

Estimating Error

There is a large number of hypotheses about the etymology of the word "Guadalupe" and its meaning: "Wolf River", "the Little Wolf", "River of Bear", "Hidden River", "Rio de cascados Negros", "Rio de lupinus", among others. Most likely the word comes from the Arabic (wad, "river"). The suffix Guada- is present in other toponyms of Arab origin. (9-10)

The French researcher Jacques Faye, specialist in the topic of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Mexico, adds that although the suffix *-lupus* has been interpreted as of Latin origin (*lupus*, Wolf), a more detailed philological investigation (*Al-kabir* article) would give us *Guad-Al-Upe*, which would mean rather "hidden river" or "boxed stream".
